CHRISTMAS BOWL VISITOR

Emele Duituturaga

Emele will be in Tasmania from Wednesday 19 November until Monday 24 November. If your congregation/school/community group would like her to come and speak during this time, please contact the TCC Office as soon as possible.

Emele Duituturaga is a development specialist, consultant and trainer with a background as a social scientist and social economist. She has had considerable regional inter-governmental and non-government experience working in the Pacific Islands development sector. For the past four years Emele Duituturaga has been working as an independent consultant in the Pacific with projects in public sector reform and institutional strengthening, donor funded project and program evaluation and facilitation and technical assistance to non-government organisations (NGOs).



She is a Board Member of the Fiji Development Bank (the only woman).

Emele is a founding member of the Pacific Island Women's Health Project. She has had experience as a community development specialist and NGO adviser in PNG with the Asian Development Bank; Regional Project Manager for the UNFPA-funded Pacific Regional Adolescent Health Project; Head of the Pacific Women's Resource Bureau at the Secretariat of the Pacific Community.

In addition, she has worked as an international consultant on development projects in the Pacific region including work on the New Zealand Overseas Development Assistance program. She also worked as a Senior Policy Adviser with the NZ Ministry of Pacific Island Affairs.

She is chair of the Social Empowerment Education Program (SEEP) with the Ecumenical Centre for Research, Education and Advocacy (ECCREA) and has worked closely with Pacific Islands Association of NGOs (PIANGO) and the Fiji Council of Social Service.

Although a Fijian and currently residing in Suva, Emele has lived most of her life in other parts of the Pacific, including 12 years in the Solomon Islands, 15 years in New Zealand, three years in Papua New Guinea and three years in New Caledonia.

THE COMMISSION ON CHRISTIAN RELIGIOUS EDUCATION IN STATE SCHOOLS

The Commission on Christian Religious Education in State Schools meets three or four times a year under the capable and enthusiastic convenership of the Rev'd Alan Bulmer. The Commission fosters, in conjunction with Heads of Churches, ecumenical religious education activity in Tasmanian state schools.

Christian Religious Education:

- is for all, regardless of family religious background
- uses educational principles and relates to children's interests and abilities
- complements other areas of learning

The CRESS Liaison Officer, Sr. Barbara Hateley MSS, does an enormous amount of work organising training sessions for volunteer teachers throughout the state. In addition to the training days, Sr. Barbara provides pastoral support and assistance to the RE teachers. She attends meetings of groups such as Ministers' Associations, as well as visiting schools and liaising with Principals.

Approximately 300 volunteer teachers go to almost 75% of the total state primary schools on a weekly basis.

An exciting area of the Commission's work has been the phenomenal growth in the number of chaplaincies in High Schools and Colleges. Chaplains are now working in 13 Schools/Colleges under the Chaplaincy Guidelines approved by the Heads of Churches and subsequently by the Education Department. It is expected that by the beginning of 2004 there could be a further five Chaplaincies.

This year Matt Durose took on the role of Convener of the CRESS Secondary Working Group. Matt works for Scripture Union as a "Chaplain to the Chaplains" and is a great support. Regular meetings are held when Chaplains and Chaplaincy Committees learn together and encourage each other.
